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Christmas Bird Count - Participants Instructions

PLEASE: This is important. Observe the following to assist in compiling accurate data for the count: **REQUIRED** per party.

- Note start and finish times to the nearest 15 mins
- Set the odometer in your vehicle or set your GPS track.
- List the party members in your group including <u>mailing address</u> (so they can receive a mailed update)
- Estimate as accurately as possible:
 - Kilometres <u>and</u> Hours driving
 - Kilometres and Hours on foot (or ski's etc)

OPTIONAL (for completion on tally sheet)

- Minimum and maximum snow depth in centimetres for your route.
- Minimum and maximum temperatures in ^o Celsius
- Sky conditions (a.m. and p.m.)
- Precipitation (form and duration)
- Wind (average speed and direction a.m. and p.m. if possible)

GENERAL

Please record only within the geographic boundaries of the count. Topographic and satellite maps of the count circle are available. If using a GPS, the count centre is **52.133° x 122.133°** (Boitanio Park) and the radius is 12 km. Use the 'go to' function to determine your distance from the centre.

Most of the birds on the list although not all 'expected' have a reasonable possibility of appearing on the count. If you encounter any birds not on the list, please add on a blank line as close as possible to the appropriate spot. Any records of birds that are <u>very</u> unusual, (even if common at other times of the year) should be accompanied by written or photographic details as the Regional Editor may well veto any sightings without adequate documentation.

If you count in a neighbouring territory, please verify your sightings with other party leaders to avoid any duplication.
